Tutor System for International Students

The tutor system was established to help new international students with studying and living in Japan. As a rule, students in their 2^{nd} year and over (including 2^{nd} year graduate students) will be chosen by the Chancellor to be tutors.

For new international students, tutors are like a friend or family member who they can consult when facing difficult or troubling times. Tutors also serve as consultants who can help with filling out paperwork at city hall, attaining a contract for a cell phone, or other instances requiring assistance.

□ Primary Roles of International Student Tutors

Tutors take on wide-ranging roles to provide support to new international students.

1. Tutors provide direct assistance with international students' study and research by giving advice regarding class preparation and revision, and help with class registration.

(Assistance with studies is the central and most important role of tutors.)

2. Tutors help international students improve their Japanese language skills.

Accompaniment to hospital in the case of illness or injury

3. Tutors help international students with their daily lives.
